Proverbs 31:25–26

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Call:

To embody strength rooted in God, not circumstance.

Duty:

To speak wisdom and model stability.

- She is not ruled by fear.
- She is not shaken by uncertainty.
- She carries confidence in God's faithfulness.



The Calling of Biblical Mothers

A Builder of Generations

To think generationally and pass down truth, faith, and identity.

Proverbs 31, Deuteronomy 6

A Nurturer of Faith & Identity

To cultivate sincere faith and establish identity rooted in Christ.

2 Timothy 1:5

A Trainer of Character

To train and model wisdom, righteousness, and godly character.

Proverbs 22:6

A Vessel of Sacrificial Love

To lay down self and love others through humility and service.

Titus 2

A Watchman & Intercessor

To cover her home, children, and generations in prayer and intercession. **1 Samuel 1, Isaiah 62**

A Builder of the Home

To build a home filled with peace, wisdom, stability, and God's presence. **Proverbs 14:1**

A Carrier of Strength & Wisdom

To walk in strength rooted in God and speak with wisdom and kindness. **Proverbs 31**

A Legacy Maker

To steward legacy by building what will remain for generations to come. **Psalms 78**

5 Characteristics of a Biblical Mother

1. Honor

A Biblical Mother is GOVERNED BY HONOR

Romans 12:9–10

Definition: Reflecting heaven's value by choosing to lead with love, humility, and self-control.

Honor reflects heaven's value. Honor protects freedom, creates safe places, and reflects a kingdom identity. Honor is about self-control, not control.

A biblical mother doesn't demand honor, she models it.

Honor is intentional, proactive, and not reactive.

Honor is not based on mood, behavior of others, whether someone "deserves" it or not.

Honor leads the way.

2. Gratitude

A Biblical Mother Lives a LIFESTYLE OF GRATITUDE

1 Thessalonians 5:15–18; Colossians 2:6–7

Definition: A heart posture of thankfulness that glorifies the Lord.

Gratitude pleases the Lord. No matter what we face, valleys or mountaintops, gratitude is the answer. Gratitude is the heart posture that seeks in all things to be thankful and glorify the Lord, because it brings you and keeps you in the presence and favor of the Lord. Because He first loved us, we will forever be grateful.

A biblical mother does not wait for good moments, she creates a culture of thanksgiving in every moment.

Gratitude is not a reaction, it is a lifestyle. It is a heart posture, not a circumstance.

Gratitude keeps you in God's presence, in alignment with truth, and in position for favor.



5 Characteristics of a Biblical Mother (cont.)

3. Selflessness

A Biblical Mother Lives SELFLESSLY

Luke 9:23; John 15:13; 1 Corinthians 10:24; Philippians 2:3-4

Definition: Selflessness is dying to self for the sake of others.

It is when you choose to put others before yourself, your rights, comfort, and preferences, for love's sake.

Selflessness is: laying down your preferences, serving others sacrificially, choosing love over self-interest, and often expressed in action

Selflessness says: "I will give up my rights for your good."

4. Meekness

A Biblical Mother Walks in MEEKNESS

Numbers 12:3; Matthew 5:5; 11:29; 26:53-54; Galatians 5:23

Definition: strength that is restrained, yielded, and governed by God.

Meekness is: a fruit of the Spirit, strength that doesn't have to prove itself, authority that is submitted to God, controlled responses instead of reactive ones, and often expressed in posture and spirit

Meekness is power under control, submitted to God. Not weakness, but controlled authority.

"Are you not aware that I can call on My Father, and He will at once put at My disposal more than twelve legions of angels? But how then would the Scriptures be fulfilled that say it must happen this way?"



5 Characteristics of a Biblical Mother (cont.)

5. Trust

A Biblical Mother Walks in TRUST

Jeremiah 17:7-8; Psalm 40:4-5; Psalm 37:5-6; Romans 8:28

Definition: Believing God's character and faithfulness over your circumstances.

Trust is not based on what you see, it is based on who God is. Trust is a decision to believe God's character over your circumstances. Trust keeps you steady in uncertainty, rooted in truth, and aligned with God's purposes
